Purpose of AraSimQC

- Allow a quick visual comparison between:
 - Different versions and releases of AraSim
 - Different detector configurations and station number
- Allow the user to easily browse all histograms of variables from all classes
- Automatically generate general purpose simulation sets for each new version/ release of AraSim
- Create website for easy viewing of AraSim output (plots, simulation sets, etc)





Purpose of AraSimQC (cont)

- AraSimQC:
 - Is a collection of interlocking bash scripts
 - Checks for updates to AraSim (releases and trunks)
 - Generates a set of output plots when changes are found
- AraSimQC automatically posts these to a website for viewing
- AraSimQC saves the simulation output so it can be downloaded and re-used later for general purposes


Work closely with Kaeli Hughes, who writes IcemcQC, the software package for the ANITA (Antarctic Impulse Transient Antenna) Experiments. Huge thanks to Dr. Carl Pfendner for mentorship and support during the development of both AraSimQC and IcemcQC.

Goals of AraSimQC

- Runs automatically—minimize human supervision
- Modular design
- Resource efficient: utilizes PBS/qsub for batch processing of simulations
- Multiple checks for errors throughout; thorough logging of errors and progress
- Easy to update as collaboration needs evolve





History of AraSimQC

- Born out of a need to keep track of the rapid changes to the AraSim code
 - ARA Collaboratoin has 10+ global partners
 - AraSim generally sees 2-3 trunk updates per month
- May-August 2014: initial code designed and written by graduate Khalida Hendricks May-August 2014 at OSU
- September 2014-present: further modifications and development maintained by Brian Clark and Kaeli Hughes (IcemcQC) also at OSU





If Code Updates are Found:

- AraSimQC download and runs the latest versions of AraSim (both releases and trunks)
- It makes a standard set of plots
- It uploads these plots to a website for viewing





If Code Updates are NOT Found:

- AraSimQC checks to see if a new plotting program has been added since the last run
- If yes, new plots are generated for all existing trunks and releases
- These updates are appended to the website





Total Automation

- Procedure is totally automatic
- Run by an automated account on OSU computing cluster
- Performed once per week by a chron job
- Manual mode possible: useful if you want to make a bunch of plots for a selected revision






Website Features: Plot Comparison

Home -> AraSimQC Internal -> Plots Comparison




- Is the primary end product of AraSimQC
- Allows easy comparison of a plot across revisions, station configurations, and energies of AraSim
- Useful "All Plots" feature, which will show you all of the plots associated with a single class
- Can easily download a PNG or PDF copy of each plot






All Plots List For First Selection










Doxygen Comment Support

- Doxygen is a tool available for generating program documentation from annotated C++ sources (also does PHP, Java, Python, etc.)
- Parses source files (header files, .cc files, etc), figures out class structure and code comments, and outputs them in easy formats
- The full doxygen documentation for AraSim is available: Home -> AraSim, link at bottom of page

Doxygen Comment Support (cont)

- The AraSimQC website displays "hint boxes" that give the meaning of plotted variables
- These definitions are generated by the doxygen comments found in the AraSim code itself
- An AraSimQC module parses the class header for the doxygen flags, outputs comments in method friendly to jQuery processing





Adding Plots

- Adding new plots is straightforward; super-user places plotting programs in a specified directory—Done!
- All plotting programs must be C++ compilable programs
- Website supports the submission of plots by the collaboration—please help us make AraSimQC better!
- New plots submissions must include:
 - 1. List of all plotting programs
 - 2. List of all plots (can have more than one plot per program)
 - 3. Attach plotting programs and makefiles
- Link and detailed instructions are on the "plots request" page (Internal Home -> Plots Request)

Website Features: Public Simulation Sets

- Simulations are resource intensive—need lots of time and computing power
- The AraSimQC output will serve as "publicly available" simulation sets (available to collaboration only)
 - Several energies (10e17 through 10e21), option for input spectrum if requested
 - Several configurations (ARA1, ARA7)
- Coming soon: the simulation sets can be accessed via the OSU ARA website
